



OPEN CLASS EXHIBITS

General Guidelines for the 2018 Uintah County Fair

Home Arts & Crafts - Check-in time will be Monday, June 4th, 11:00 am - 7 pm.

Floriculture, Vegetables and Feed Crops - Check-in time is Thursday, June 7th, 10:00 am – 12 noon

Checkout Time will be Monday, June 11th, 9 am - 1:00 pm. No earlier withdrawals please.

Fair Committee is not responsible for articles left after the checkout time. Ribbon will be forfeited for early withdrawal.

Entries are limited to Uintah County residents.

All articles exhibited must be the work of the exhibitor. Work previously entered in a fair cannot be entered again. Ribbon will be forfeited if not the work of the exhibitor.

No commercial exhibits are allowed in the Home Arts and Crafts exhibit area.

Each exhibitor may enter a limit of two exhibits per class.

Age divisions for exhibitors will be:

Youth - up to 11 years

Junior - 12 - 17 years

Adult - 18 - 64 years

Senior - 65 and above

Professionals: those making fifty percent of their income in any exhibiting class or those teaching in said class will enter for display only.

Judging and Awards

1. Each entry will be judged on its own merit and will be awarded a blue or red ribbon.
2. Only Judges and Clerks may be present in the area while judging is taking place. Judging and awards are not completed until the Home Arts and Crafts Fair opens. Please do not come in until after the doors open to the public.

The Fair Committee will make every effort to protect and safeguard each exhibit but will not be liable for exhibits. The Fair Committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit that may be offensive or deemed inappropriate.

The above rules apply only to the Uintah County Fair. If interested in entering the Utah State Fair, see State Fair book.

Class 105: Green and Potherbs

1. Collards - 1 bunch

2. Kale - 1 bunch

4. New Zealand spinach - 1/4 lbs. edible stalks

5. Spinach, Savoy - 5 plants, roots attached, washed

6. Spinach, Smooth - 5 plants, roots attached, washed

7. Swiss Chard - Green (Lucullus) - 5 stalks

8. Swiss Chard - Red (Rhubarb) - 5 stalks

Class 106: Herbs (aromatic - kitchen)

Harvest and dried for use. It is suggested that each sample be in a quart size clear plastic bag for exhibition.

1. Jerusalem Artichokes

Class 109: Root Crops I

1. Onions - 2" minimum - table stock

2. Potatoes - plate, 5 potatoes

3. Red Sweet - 2 onions

4. White Sweet - 2 onions

5. Yellow Sweet - 2 onions

Class 110: Root Crops II

1. Beets - 5 roots, tops off, washed

2. Carrots - 5 roots, tops off, washed

3. Parsnips, turnips, rutabaga, salsify, horse radish - 5 roots, edible, maturity, tops off, washed.

4. Radish Roots

Class 111: Salad Crops

1. Celery 1 plants or bunches trimmed for sale
2. Endive - 2 plants, trimmed
3. Lettuce - plants or bunches trimmed for sale
4. Parsley - 1/4 lb. bunch

Class 112: Solanaceous Fruits

1. Egg Plant - 2 fruits
2. Pepper - 2 fruits
3. Tomato - ripe, 2 fruits without stem, small - 10 fruits less than 1"

Class 113: Sweet Corn, Popcorn, Indian Corn, Okra

1. Indian Corn
2. Okra - 5 fruits or pods
3. Popcorn - 2 ears
4. Sweet Corn - 2 ears, husked

Class 114: Miscellaneous Vegetables
